

SERIES BIBLE

(TEMPLATE)

COVER PAGE

(SERIES TITLE)

- Make this pop!
- This sets the tone for the rest of your document – keep it all consistent, same photo treatments, same fonts.
- Use the right font for the title. You want to make sure the font has the same feel as the tone.
- You can add your contact info or save it for the back page, or both (small, not too distracting)

LOGLINE

[1 slide/page]

- Let this page breathe, or in other words, try not to overcrowd the page with images. There won't be much text here - and that's okay.
- One larger background image may be best here.

LOGLINE HACKS:

(use the one that best works for you)

- 1) Protagonist (has problem) and must (achieve goal) to solve that problem.
- 2) Protagonist (has a goal) but (major obstacle) stands in their way.
- 3) (Situation) causes (main character) to face (largest obstacle) and (outcome).
- 4) When (inciting incident occurs) a (specific protagonist) must (objective) or else (stakes).

STRUCTURE

[1 slide/page]

- One-hour, half-hour?
 - Episodic, serialized, anthology?
- Mini-series? Limited series? Event series?
 - Future season possibilities?
- Reference some pre-existing archetypes
(if specific to the structure
ex. This Is Us – non-linear timeline)
- Why? (ex. Why a half-hour vs full hour?)

INTRO

[1 slide/page]

- Keep it short, clear and to the point
(*Can be combined with the previous page – add your intro to the logline slide as an option to save on page count)
- Give a broad overview of the details of your story
- Try not to go into the details of: the world, the genre or the characters (these come later)
 - Which audience will it appeal to?
- Think of this as a teaser. You want your reader to know what the story is about but to also want to know more/read more

GENRE

[1 slide/page]

- Describe all the different genres, subgenres, themes and influences
 - How do they affect the world?

THE WORLD

[1 slide/page]

- Where do your characters live?
 - Year
 - Location
- What makes their world different than our own?
 - What is the central conflict?
- Use strong visuals as examples of similar worlds
 - How does the world impact the characters?

CHARACTERS

[1-3 slides/pages]

(3-6 Characters - basic details only)

- Personality, flaws, what makes them tick?
 - Which actors/existing characters were the inspiration behind their traits and personality?
 - Their role in the grand scheme of things
 - Their relationships with other characters
 - 1 line for each character describing the conflict they're dealing with
- Their arc(s) (from beginning to end - how does the character grow and change, what is their journey?)

SYNOPSIS

[1 slide/page]

- Series synopsis
- Elaborate on your intro (without repetition)
 - Story arcs (not character arcs)
 - Build conflict without specifics
- Be sure not to go too much into: characters, the world, tone and style, similar shows and films
(the pages dedicated to these topics will follow)

tone & style

[1-2 slides/pages]

- Filters (colors/tones)
- Comps - examples of: other films with similar tone & style, specific shots, director styles
 - Locations
 - Music
 - Costumes / Makeup
 - Editing and camera techniques
- + any other visuals that set the tone

EPISODE SYNOPSES

[1-2 slides/pages]

- Write out a synopsis of each episode in logline format or try to limit it to a paragraph per episode
 - Describe all episodes in season 1
- Mention briefly what season 2-3 would have in store for viewers

BACK COVER/ABOUT THE WRITER(S)

- Repeat visuals/style/colors from the cover
 - Why you?
 - Why now?
- Add contact info + About the writer(s)
(simple info, 1-2 paragraphs and include a photo of yourself if you'd like)
